

Activities of a nurse in a hospital

- 4. **Nursing and support:** Nursing includes basic tasks such as assisting with personal hygiene, eating, mobilization, and elimination. The care also includes emotional support for patients.
- 5. **Documentation:** Accurate documentation of nursing interventions, patients' health status, and other relevant information is especially important in the hospital.
- 6. **Communication:** Nurses communicate with patients, relatives, doctors, and other members of the healthcare team to ensure that all relevant information is shared.
